Report on the Financial Statements

Auditor's Opinion

1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(I.) Basis of Accounting

(i) Company maintain its accounts on accrual basis following the historical cost convention in compliance with the Accounting Standards Specified to be mandatory by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and relevant provision of the Companies Act, 2013. "The Company is a Small and Medium Sized Company (SMC) as defined in the General Instructions in respect of Accounting Standards notified under the Companies Act, 2013. Accordingly, the Company has complied with the Accounting Standards as applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Company." (ii) Accounting policies not specifically referred to otherwise are in consonance with generally accepted accounting principles.

(II.) Revenue Recognition

Revenue/Income/Expenses are generally accounted on accrual basis.

(III.) Retirement Benefits

Payment of Gratuity and Provident fund are not applicable to the company.

(IV.) Taxes on Income

- (a) Current corporate tax is provided on the profit for the year after considering applicable tax rates and laws.
- (b) Deferred tax is provided in accordance with the Accounting Standards 22, Accounting for taxes on Income, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India on timing differences between tax and accounting treatments that originate in one period and are expected to be reversed or settled in subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets or liabilities are measured using the enacted tax rates for the current year. Adjustment of deferred tax assets or liability attributable to change in tax rates is shown in the profit and loss account as a part of deferred tax adjustment for the year. In respect of carry forward losses and unabsorbed depreciation, deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date.

(V.) Contingent Liability

Contingent liabilities are determined & disclosed on the basis of available information.

(VI.) Impairment of Assets

Impairment of loss is charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the period in which, an asset is indentified as impaired, when the carrying value of the asset exceeds its recoverable value. The impairment loss recognized in the prior accounting periods is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

(VII.) Provision, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources to settle the obligation that can be reliably estimated. Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed.

(VIII.) Borrowing Cost

Borrowing cost attributable to acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of that assets, till the assets is ready for use. Other Borrowing costs are recognized as an expense in the period in which these are incurred.

(IX.) Others

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.
